1. ENVIRONMENT

More landscaping, maybe a water feature, window boxes.

War Memorial & grass area opposite.(19)

Flower beds in the grass area (39) also trees & shrubs(13)

Grass cut more often and collected rather than left to rot on top – it looks so messy

Re-instate lovely old cattle/horse trough . Would look stunning filled with flowers if replaced.

Pond with seating, reinstate Ketchmere village pond, perhaps with ducks (8).

Park (Recreation Ground) (47)

General comments

Plant more native trees, Oak/Hornbeam/Hawthorne/Walnut/London Plane in Central areas, Crendon Hill, Chearsley Road, Bicester Road, Peascroft, on estates & around sewage farm. (13)

Plant trees along Coltman Ave/Giffard Way/Bonnersfield on grass verges

General comments(cont)

Cut grass verges regularly especially Easington-Long Crendon stretch. Improve general upkeep of bushes & trees (4)

Retain all grassed areas and hedges from slowly being paved over.

More easy to maintain trees/flowers wherever possible (15).

Add more flowers and colour to village roads and hedgerows (2)

More flowers on grassed island outside 23/25 Giffard Way, Ketchmere Close & area behind garages/Bonnersfield

Get all householders to mow grass on the verge outside their house.

Idea is good but vandals will destroy what's done.

War Memorial (45)

Grass cutting and weeding need improvement, general tidying up, there is often broken glass (5)

The green is a bit boring - All year round floral arrangements to brighten it up including some real poppies as they are flowers of the war. Perhaps more generous planting of perennials or small shrubs/flowering trees, grasses, a wildlife corner & bulbs for Spring – or get rid of flower border and extend grass and shrubs.(8)

Needs to be more prominent and incorporated into a main pedestrian access to park. Seems to be hidden away behind hedges. (2)

At night needs lighting. (2)

It is a disgrace and a shameful way to remember those who gave lives for our good. Care of garden seems voluntary. Would be nice to have it cleaned, it looks shabby and unloved (6)

Crosses & wreaths should be left in place longer.

Remove tree opposite.

Link with primary school.

War Memorial (cont)

Move the War Memorial near to the church.

The Square

Urgently need more rubbish collection/ bins (52) Total mess with beer cans, broken beer bottles & chip papers (evenings)(4). Sweeping/Weeding required (8)

More thought and attention to area - Facelift & landscape (41)

Need to maintain grid drain and gully as car park often floods (13)

Return to its former open area, congestion means accidents always possible. Parking needs improvement by perhaps reducing the width of path to improve the parking area so we do not reverse into one another. (4) Remove trees make more room for parking. (2) Area for buses and lorries can park off the road, when they stop to use the shop etc.

Create a more traditional look with extra seating (11).

Change the orange Happy Shopper fascia– not attractive, needs repainting, the signs/window displays are too 'loud' (same for Chip shop) (12)

Removal of temp shop signs from roadside in Square (A boards)

Create access to park directly from Square.

Have a Christmas Tree (2)

The Star

Chinese signs seen as an eyesore, disgusting, totally out of character, scruffy and cheap.(44)

Lower End

Declined from its picturesque setting – untidy 'Mound' and cottages where grass areas are allowed to grow too long to walk over comfortably. Either a path (preferable) or close mown grass would be better (7)

Footpath access required for baby buggy & weeds need to be maintained from Trove House to Carters Lane

Relocate 30 mph signs and gates at village boundary rather than centrally in Lower End as existing. Present signs spoil view across the Green

Re-instate pond.

Church End

Skip & building site that has sat outside a cottage at Church End for 16 months, general problem with number of skips (3)

Unauthorized access that has been made at the property at the end (2)

Cemetery grass should be mown more regularly.

Tree base growth removal (4)

Plant more flowers (2)

Farthings (2)

Builders skips.

Tree base growth removal.

Cut shrubs back.

Chilton Road

Cut shrubs back on corner.

Carters Lane

Overgrown bushes obscure turn right.

General.

Improve some buildings, smarten up or paint.

Are there any improvements that could be made?

General

Cut back grass, nettles & hedges more often, farmers should cut back grass, brambles, low branches etc a bit more often. Can be dangerous particularly after leaf fall. Exposed roots are dangerous(116)

If tackled in shorts nettle rash (8)

More well signposted footpaths & safe walks(5) A connection between the path down past the donkey field by Church End and the field at the bottom of the Harroell playing field. Create cycle ways.(3)

Better signage, some signage is broken, some obscured by growth (25),When crossing a field mark line of route, Better publicity(6), Display map of footpaths in The Square or leaflet in post office.(2) More general information especially to the local school.

Clean up dog poo (6) More dog bins(at entrances) (24) More litter bins.

Better dog walking routes needed, no real circular routes(2), Over friendly dogs kept on leads away from runners.

Gradual replacement of stiles with kissing gates. Styles difficult for disabled, buggies and dogs(9) Hold points for disabled to make paths safer.(2) Maintenance of styles & gates, some gates could be easier to open(7). Paths not wide enough for pushchairs, styles overgrown and need trimming.

Footpaths/bridleways need gravelling, horses make paths muddy.(2)

Concerned about safety implications of increase in amount of clay pigeon shooting

Users could report problems, but do they know who to report to?

They are OK. We do live in the country, would prefer them to remain informal and natural, keep them open!

Westfield Road to Shabbington (4)

Footpath and bridleway overgrown and unclear, styles need repairs.

Maintain using a hard surface so as to be able to cycle to Shabbington & Ickford & Worminghall Sometimes bridleway is blocked with fallen trees etc and is not cleared very quickly

By the Mound

Bushes and plants obscuring walkway - path unsafe and overgrown (5)

Footpath not adequate to access houses at Lower End. Particularly dangerous for pushchairs.(3)

Highfield

The cul-de-sac top needs bushes cut.

Chearsley Road to Easington

Path overgrown

Between Billwell and Frogmore Lane (7)

Clear lost path & maintain

Church to Notley Abbey (Donkey Field)

Length of grass(2), needs cutting back,(5)

Needs overhanging bushes and nettles cutting back, grass edges of the pathway cut back, wild area mown and gravel maintained more frequently.(3)

The right of way footpaths round the back by railings need attention and lighting(2)

Thame Rd – Abbots Ridge has never been attended to in 30 years.

Dog fouling at bottom.

Pavement to Thame(45) – see section “1d” & “3e”

Needs urgent improvement as it is most unsafe (2)

Need a cycle route and proper footpath to continue to Thame

Encourage residents to reduce consumption and use eco-friendly/recycled products

Recycling by the DC seems very poor compared to other councils (2). Maybe PC could consider general bins which have sections, eg plastics, paper, glass as they have in some European countries. These could be collected by bin collections (recycling). On outskirts of village, but screened with suitable parking properly serviced and maintained.

Garden waste left out in green sacks should be collected by AVDC. At present they will take only take waste left in the plastic bags bought at the Post Office – these are much too small. We should use large re-usable garden sacks as in Bristol.

Install a temporary facility in the half acre during Christmas/New Year.

No glass/paper collection in Easington. In our area of the village they don't seem to collect glass.

One of my neighbours repeatedly has bonfires to burn garden waste and the smoke blows over my house and garden. Very annoying and I have complained to no avail.

Less picky bin men about what they take. Baskets should be left considerately when emptied. Plastics and paper often blow down the road on a windy day.

Use school's recycling – foil, plastic, paper, composting etc

Provide a paper bank in the village – this is not noisy and could be sited by the tennis courts.

Confusion as to what can/cannot be recycled. eg bottles/glass

Perhaps local shops could help.

We do not want a recycling centre on the Industrial Estate as proposed by the AVDC.

Chearsley Road:-Extend 30/40 limit to last house(or Notley)(**35**) Cars go far too fast (**27**) It is like a speed track.Its ridiculous that there is a 60 mph section past houses(**5**). Make it 30 mph to end of village(**8**). We try to walk the children up to school and the road is terrifying. When the school children measured the speed of traffic within the 30 mph zone (by 8 bells) they clocked many cars at 40-50 mph. So extend the 30 mph zone to the edge of the village and put down speed cushions, very dangerous for children at present, walking or cycling. Urgent action required as far at Notley turn. Reduce 60mph to 40 mph a fair distance before 30 mph, increase in traffic due to new limits on Aylesbury Road and short cuts using sat nav.(**2**)

If so, what more could be done to reduce the speed of traffic? (cont)

Bicester Road:-Extend 30 limit further out of village(to Woodcray Farm?)(13) The junction of Carters Lane very dangerous because of speeding traffic coming over the hill from Lower End.(2) everyone knows we don't have a camera, traffic comes thro 30 zone at 60 miles/hr, reduce 60mph to 40 mph a fair distance before 30 mph, at the roundabout not well signposted from far enough back,lots of beeping indicating near misses. Maybe there could be calming on the approaches to roundabout.

Thame Road:- The humps in the road are placed poorly as people accelerate down the hill out of the village and it's difficult to exit Peascroft Junction. 30 mph extended to Drakes Drive(4) – provision of roundabout and reduce acuteness of bend leading from Drakes Drive into L Crendon. On numerous occasions wider vehicles traveling at excessive speeds has required drastic avoidance action by us.

20MPH speed limit:-Lower speed limit eg High St(2), Frogmore Lane, problem areas, school(3), B4011 around The Square(6)

The Square:- Speed calming should be set up to slow traffic around Square where children and older people are likely to be crossing to shops(2). Cars speed through the Square

Coltman Ave/Giffard Way/Highfield/Bonnars field (4) :- people going too fast round corners – Small ramps possible?

High Street:- Slow traffic down(3), is impossible at times with selfish drivers much too speedy

Easington:- Extend 30 mph limit from Easington to edge of village, 30 mph sign either side of Easington Terrace (2). We have witnessed 2 car accidents within one year of being here. I've had a car through my front door, as has the pub, 30 mph through Easington. People seem to think it is Silverstone around the very dangerous bends. Frequently cars speed down from Chilton into village. (2)

One way system:- Sandy Lane, Frogmore Lane, Burts Lane

Other ideas:- NO mobile police cameras!! It really does cause resentment of police and their supposed 'source resource', but lets have more 'fixed' means of slowing traffic, avoid chicanes as in Haddenham, results in speed up/speed down behaviour. Use average speed recognition system.

Motorbikes:- Stop motorbikes speeding through village. Motorcyclists are particular offenders

General comments:- Warning signs that children are about, drunk drivers, driving around village – more police, increase curved sections of road and created 20 mph limit, lower speed limits on country lanes.

If no, where and what improvements could be made?

To Roads:-

Thame/Bicester Road:- Roads are extensively patched (4), by Newsagent and opposite hairdresser. Manhole covers need sorting as they make hard clanking noise when traffic goes over them(7) ,hill is lethal due to water on road from sewage farm which ices over on sharp bend in winter(2), 50-64 Bicester Road side roads have pot holes (2), roads and pavements need to be straight and horizontal, the speed cushions are damaging to cars 'straddling' them & getting damaged on Barrow Hill(10), signage should be provided to advise motorists to traverse them, holds surface water in centre soaking pedestrians, large puddles by mini roundabout

Cheersley Road(8):- Large number of pot holes, poor repairs, patching(34), many cats eyes loose

Chilton Road(8):- Large holes along edge of road needs resurfacing not done for 20 years,to Mole & Chicken great potholes on sides of road very dangerous, especially for cyclists potholes need repairing sooner (2)

Windmill Way(10):- Poor condition

Carters Lane:- Road in terrible state, resurface(2), Elm Trees- earth slippage & snow clearance

Giffard Way(17):- Road needs improving – holes,

Bonnorsfield:- Holes in road need repairing

Westfield Road (3):- Full of potholes and this single track road is subsiding and speeding traffic using it is making it very dangerous for walkers,

Highfield Road(2):- Roads not been repaired for years, potholes and pavement falling away

High Street(2):- Signs need repair and cleaning, cleaning of road done too early before cars have moved, gutters never get done because of parking.

Burts Lane(2):- In a bad state

Frogmore Lane(3):- Potholes

General:- Are a mess/full of potholes/need repairing, potholes need filling immediately so don't get bigger (8), general maintenance is poor, must be worst in Bucks, could do with a pavement on both sides on some roads, could be swept more often (2), general safety – mow verges more often(2)

To Pavements:-

Thame Road(5):- Is a death trap, overgrown and uneven (2), upgrade to cycle path, better cleaning of pavement (around stables) and cutting of hedges

High Street(11):- Pavements are poor and are very uneven, easy to trip, full in potholes and damaged kerbs, some pavements are too narrow, the sloping pavement can be difficult for older people in winter and bad weather e.g .Churchill to library (16), electric scooters have tipped over(3), Churchill hanging baskets cause problem when watered, near the library the path and its steps are dangerous, outside Church House towards church slopes too much, poor state of repair by Court House

Lower End:- Poorly maintained

Bicester Road:- Resurfaced with shoddy tarmac, too narrow e.g. outside garage and neglected(3), by Coltman Avenue

Carters Lane(7):-Needs repair , Elm Trees too narrow

Chilton Road:- too narrow

Frogmore Lane:- Needs widening as well as improving the surface, many potholes, very dangerous for cyclists, walking when poor visibility etc., ditch clearance

Sandy Lane(3):- Overgrown bushes/rotting leaves

Sycamore Close:- Needs repair & widening(2)

Giffard Way(16):-Has had holes in pavement for many years, bumpy surface.

Cheersley Road:- By park & scout hut not wide enough for wheelchair (hedge cutting) (5) Banks and verges (the 60 mph section) are encroaching on the roadway, making a fast road even more narrow. All pavements need checking they are in a poor state & are slippery with moss

Highfield Road(2):- Some pavement have been tarmaced leaving them slanted.

The Square:- General pavements are unclean

Bilwell:- in rain footpath is a river, behind Star blocked by tables & chairs

Burts Lane:-Pavements uneven, cut back bushes, trees hang over

Peascroft and Jesses Lane/Harroell:- Needs repairing, used mainly by OAPs, nettles and weeds covering most of path

Hilltop(3):- Overgrown bushes/rotting leaves

To Pavements:- (cont)

General(15):- Need repair/have lots of potholes, are uneven and unsafe, need regular inspection to show where maintenance is required, overhanging plants need cutting back more regularly , dog mess, overhanging foliage can be a problem(3), sweeping should be increased, there are a lot of road chippings on a lot of paths. Bits of branch all sizes down the hill, slippery when wet(19), tree roots through surface

Outside Willow Tree Cottage:-A lot of potholes

To Street Lighting

Additional lighting needed/ not bright enough:- Park(4), Coltman Avenue, Gifford Way(2), High Street(2)- Church House to library, at Bicester Road Bus Stop between Highfield & Coltman Ave(2), between Hilltop & Abbots Ridge(2), footpath Jesses Lane to Peascroft(8), Bonnersfield – Inadequate, needs more lights, very dark near Quarry Close (2), vandals congregate here and intimidate the elderly, Harroell High Strret end,as far as Mole & Chicken,Gifford Way(2), Frogmore Lane at night pavement very dark and dangerous(2), Lower End(7), Chilton Road/Lacemakers(10), Cheersley Road(2), Sandy Lane/Wapping - no lights, at crossing in Square, Thame Road, Carters Lane street lighting is dull we need brighter lights (2).

Too much light:- New light too bright outside bedroom window, a shield on house side would be helpful.(doesn't say where), turn off at 22.00 or midnight, from tennis courts, lighting left on unnecessarily late!, Elm Trees - ridiculous amount of light, light pollution all night, but pitch black lanes on the edges of village, half light from Elm Trees could be used round the village!

Time to repair:- Coltman Ave - some have been broken for ages and it doesn't look like they're going to be fixed, Highfield - light doesn't work by No 6 (5), lighting far too slow to be fixed when bulbs out (9).

General:- Newish street lighting very attractive (2), some lights need painting

Bicester Road:- by the garage path blocked(8), bus stop used for parking vans and cars(5), outside hairdressers(5), outside 20 Bicester Road I use a mobility scooter and cannot use the pavement at times because it is completely across the pavement, outside the Angel (8), cars park on verges, could create a few more parking bays into grasses area where needed.

The Square/Bilwell(56):- Many places are taken by shop owners and some residents, 2 hour parking limit, some days cars are left all day, stop vans and cars parking on zig zags outside the shop and Indian restaurant, 30 minute restriction to stop cars parking there all day, make diagonal parking as difficult to manoeuvre in and out of spaces, alter kerb off main road, get rid of trees to create more space, problem at back of Star, some yellow lines by butcher and back of Star, resident only parking in Bilwell

Outside school(47):- Add double yellow lines around the bend into Carters Lane and outside the school(6), open up the school grounds, consideration for local residents access please, more children should walk or cycle (4), safety hazard for school children, need a village policeman to enforce the existing law, stop turning in Pitters Piece, at weekends as people do not observe parking zones (2), when there is something on at the school and at pick-up drop off times, use lower end of school playing field – roadside – to create parking with access and exit

Chilton Road(10):- Opposite Windmill Way create layby outside old people's bungalows, turn grass verges into layby's

Chearsley Road(50):

Dentist:-Add yellow lines by dentist(5), near dentist sometimes it is impossible to turn into Chearsley Rd from roundabout(3)

Recreation Ground:- park one side only by park, provide parking bays where narrow strip of grass and reduce width of footpaths to accommodate the parking, when football on, very busy and dangerous, should have put more car parking instead of tennis court(2), better parking for football matches, use half scout hut site, stop the parking opposite the park, makes it dangerous to cross road, need new public car park for match days(4)

High Street (122):-

Parking restrictions:-Need double lines on High Street up to Churchill Arms, red line outside cottages 11-9, Residents parking (1 per house!) is the answer(2), parking on junction from main road into High Street, would like to see some designated residents parking near Church House, bollards.

General: Parking real problem in the evenings, residents ignore driveways and park in others, would be no access for emergency services (9), car park is required somewhere, parking areas away from houses, outside library/social club need more spaces

If yes, where and what improvements could be made?(cont)

Doctors surgery:- Especially parking near doctors surgery (9) disabled bay needed outside doctors, parking outside doctors has moved to opposite side of street during Lane renovation – now people mount the pavement by 55 to pass, there might have to be restrictions, should be re-sited to school playing fields

Church House:- Outside Church House (5) – Should only have functions of a size that can accommodate the number of cars, better use of space especially on Bridge night(7)

Traffic changes:- The time has come to go 'one way' down the High Street (2), make it access only, restrict larger lorries

Baptist Church:- Especially on Sunday owing to influx of Baptists (5), Baptist Church not always considerate (2), Baptist Church/club users should use parking at back of tennis courts and not in front of villagers houses in high street.(4), ask Baptists to car share, Baptist Church should have its own car park, I need to park outside Baptist Church on a Sunday as both my ankles are damaged. Parking needs to be facilitated, especially when Toybox is on, parking Sunday mornings and evenings in Wainwrights(12)

Jesses Lane:- Fri/Sat nights At entrance need bollards to stop this parking. Wooden posts at edge of grass banks. Grass verges on Jesses Lane damaged by parking (2), parking so much fire/ambulance would be unable to come down parking from pub overflows

Burts Lane:- Make it one way (7) and single parking, parking on corners

Lower End(2):- On greens and verges

Carters Lane;- Car parked almost permanently at bottom – restricts access(2), stop school parking(4)

Coltman Avenue:- Parking top and bottom (2), Bicester Road junction make a no parking zone Some houses have 3 or 4 cars parked in road overnight/parked on corners/parked on verges/parked on road junctions. Perhaps occasional purge to warn car owners of illegally parked vehicles

Giffard Way (24):- Charge for parking, cannot get a vehicle wider than fiesta down cul de sac at weekends due to parking on pavements, no access for emergency vehicles, lack of parking, put yellow lines on bends, make more parking areas off road.

Highfield(5):- Emergency vehicles could not get through, owners should use their driveways, put down double yellow lines

Bonnorsfield:- by flats (4) Some houses have 3 or 4 cars parked in road overnight/parked on corners/parked on verges/parked on road junctions. Perhaps occasional purge to warn car owners of illegally parked vehicles

If yes, where and what improvements could be made?(cont)

Friars Furlong:- Some houses have 3 or 4 cars parked in road overnight/parked on corners/parked on verges/parked on road junctions. Perhaps occasional purge to warn car owners of illegally parked vehicles

Thame Road:- Unable to park outside own home.

Abbot Ridge:- at bottom on grass and pavement (3) Perhaps a bit of grass area beside the flats could be turned into extra parking bays between lamp post and cut in by bungalows

Peascroft (6):- Make people more aware of parking, put lorries in the car parks not parked overnight on the road, does not have adequate parking for residents, could be re-designed to improve parking, allocated parking

Hilltop Estate(4):- Cars often park in High Street where there is limited parking.Parking on corner of roads

General comments:- Only the inconsiderate people who park badly, more off road parking, all housing estates to have more car parks with lights on all junctions of estates (3) Cars park on grass verges and pavements all over village(30), people should THINK before they park STOP parking on pavements, more yellow lines to force residents to use driveways(11), people should use their garages for the purpose intended! lorries try to squeeze past parked cars in small roads, and scrape verges/paths, people are selfish, drivers seem to think they have the right to park outside their house, wherever it may be, having no regard for other road users, all grass verges need to be tarmaced over to provide more parking spaces
